Hartsell planning round-the-world airship race



Don Hartsell, a Texas alumnus turned lawyer turned technology entrepreneur knows his idea sounds like it is up in the air. Literally. He has been working for several years to coordinate the world's first roundthe-world airship race. Billed as the World Sky Race (www.worldskyrace.com), Hartsell envisions a fleet of blimps, zeppelins and

other lighter-than-air skyships departing from the Greenwich Prime Meridian in London sometime in 2014, racing 30,000 miles around the globe, and then arriving back at the Prime Meridian at Versailles Palace in Paris six months later – around the world in 180 days. Along the way, the aircraft would pass over some 130 of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) World Heritage sites, including the Egyptian pyramids, the Taj Mahal, the Statue of Liberty and the Eiffel Tower. UNESCO is the cultural and educational co-partner of the event. NASA is providing logistics assistance. Hartsell predicts 140 million people around the world will witness the race – making it one of the largest live sporting/ entertainment events ever seen.

Hartsell is the founder, Commissioner and Managing Director of the World Air League, a group of airship sports enthusiasts. He is also Chairman and CEO of Solex Environmental Systems and former CEO of Solex Robotics Systems.
